## **Democracy**

- √ Through our curricular clubs and opportunities, children are given the freedom to make choices.

- ✓ Our PSHE curriculum embodies values of mutual respect through units of learning such as relationships and being a responsible citizen.

- ✓ We have links with the local police through the PCSO.
- ✓ We have a clearly structured behaviour policy which all stakeholders understand and follow, which has been created in consultation with children so they are held accountable for their own actions.
- ✓ We have whole school rules and expectations to model being a good person, learning life skills so they can make a positive contribution to the world.
- ✓ We regularly review behaviour incidents in school and share these with key stakeholders.
- ✓ Assemblies are delivered with a focus on the law e.g. Road Safety, NSPCC and E-Safety as appropriate throughout the year.
